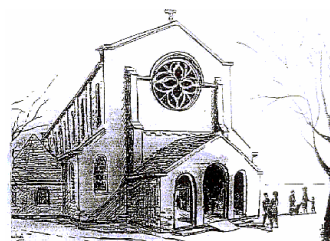

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY The churches of Newmarket invite you to share in an Inter-church Act of Remembrance to commemorate **HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY** in our church on Sunday 27th January at 7.00pm.

Café (Catholic Faith Exploration) The first session of our Café programme which will run throughout LENT will take place on Tuesday 12th February from 7.00-9.00pm. The series is about the CREED, you are warmly welcome to attend this and any subsequent sessions as you wish. You don't have to commit yourself to the whole programme.

EDUCATION SUNDAY Sun 20th Jan is education Sun and the 10.30am Mass is a children's Mass. That means that the readings will be from the children's Lectionary and the Sermon will be at the children's level. There is, therefore, no children liturgy. The children will be undertaking some of the ministry such as readings, bidding prayers, offertory, greeting and collections. The Mass will be followed by a Bring and Share lunch in the Parish centre. Please come and make it a very special occasion for the children and the parish.
