National Cycle of Prayer- First week of Lent.—World Day of Prayer on 1st Friday in March. The World Day of Prayer is a world-wide movement of Christian Women who come together to observe a common day of prayer held on the first Friday in March each year, And who, in many countries, have a continuing relationship in prayer and service. Through the World Day of Prayer women are encouraged to become aware of their talents and use them in the service of the wider community.

Prayer: Father, you have given all peoples one common origin, and your will is to gather them as one family in yourself. Fill the hearts of all women with the fire of your love and the desire to ensure justice for all. Hear the prayer offered you by women throughout the world for an end to all division, and a human society built on love and peace.

Our First reading today also takes place in a garden. God creates human beings from the soil, reminding us of our close relationship with the earth and our Creator. In the gospel, Jesus resists temptation, pointing to God as the foundation of our lives. As we begin the season of lent, may our common dependance on God and our love for all creation, inspire us to help families fighting the effects of the climate crisis, as we join with others to tackle the causes of climate change.

Food Bank

The numbers of people using our Thursday Pop up Foodbank is steadily rising. We regularly get 60 visitors a week now. They come from all parts of society, young families, middle aged people who have lost a job, or have suffered family breakdown, and pensioners who are trying to meet the cost of living. They also include Ukrainian people who have limited income in this country. We receive kind donations from parishioners, including cash with which we buy fresh meat and eggs, but our tinned food and vegetables come from the permanent food bank run by Opendoor. Following a glut over Christmas, their stocks have run low and we are particularly short of tinned meats.
