


## Urgent: Stop UK Government Funding China's Genocidal Regime SPUC

(The Society for the Protection of the Unborn Children) will be holding a Petition Day next weekend. SPUC wants a world where abortion is unthinkable, and is raising awareness of the widespread problem of abortion coercion. The petition calls for the Prime Minister to end the Government's unacceptable funding of China's totalitarian state. The Chinese state imposes forced abortion, sterilisation and infanticide on its own population, notably the Uyghur minority. According to the Chief Commissioner of the Independent Commission for Aid Impact, the UK Government sent over £60 million to China in 2020-21. Please sign the petition to help defend unborn babies, and their mothers, by highlighting this terrible human rights abuse.

Pilgrimage of Reparation & Prayer for the Sanctity of Life, to Walsingham on Saturday 5th August, led by Archbishop Kevin McDonald. There is great need for prayer. The UK Government have pressed on with their determination to impose abortion on the unwilling population of Northern Ireland. There is continued pressure to introduce Assisted Suicide, a Parliamentary Committee in England and Wales is currently taking evidence. Looking more widely there is increasingly aggressive silencing of views opposed to the liberal agenda, the latest examples being the arrest of a woman for silently praying outside an abortion clinic which was not even open, and the imposition of 'buffer zones' around abortion facilities. We hope that you will encourage many parishioners to join the pilgrimage, if not in person then online, and through the year to come to help as many as possible to 'accept the gift' of life.

We know only too well that lives which are controlled, coerced and groomed into trafficking, sex work and exploitation result in addiction, homelessness, trauma, and severe and enduring mental health issues. We know that relationships can transform lives and we have established an excellent reputation for building trusted relationships and providing trauma and gendered support engaging with those who are marginalised, hidden and experiencing multiple disadvantages. Our expertise makes us well placed to recognise the routes into sexual exploitation and effective prevention interventions. Our

spectrum of services includes:

**Doorway Women's services** works with women victims of sexual violence and exploitation in Norwich and provides tailored support covering every aspect of women's lives.

ROSE provides support for young people affected by child sexual exploitation (CSE) throughout Norfolk. Lockdown played a huge role in them spending more time alone, at home on their devices and last year we saw an increase of 50% for referrals for young people who have been groomed online to send images of themselves to strangers.

Jigsaw Education programmes starts early by going into schools and colleges throughout Norfolk to deliver engaging and interactive sessions on key topics such as online safety, consent, peer-on-peer abuse, sexual violence, and healthy and exploitative relationships If you can raise children's awareness of what constitutes healthy relationships and develop their understanding of key issues such as consent and grooming, you can reduce exploitation.

We would value your ongoing support through providing someone who feels compassion for our work to join our six weekly prayer group or volunteering programme.
