Advanced notice—Office Summer Closure

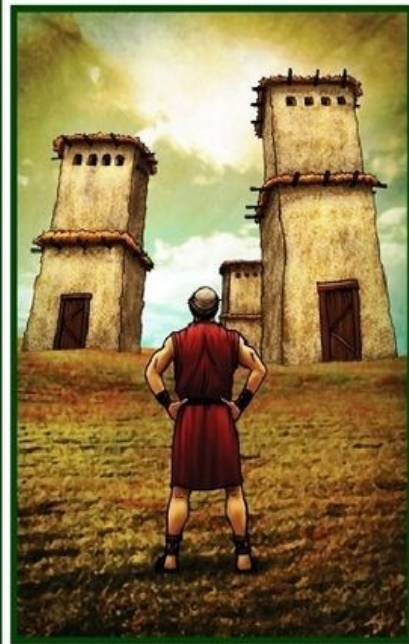
