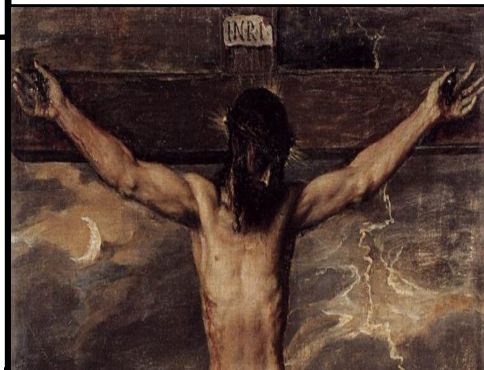

National Cycle of Prayer- Second week of Lent.-

Penitence and Wanderers: The twin themes of Lent are Baptism and penance. Lent is a time of reflection and preparation for Easter. Many parishes offer opportunities for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance in the Lenten season. In recent years some parishes have explored using the Lenten period as a time to assist those returning to the church after a period of not being active in the life of the Church. This reflects the ancient practise of the Order of Penitents which reached its end on the morning of Holy Thursday.

Prayer: God of power and might, we praise you through your Son, Jesus Christ, who comes in your name. He is the word that brings salvation. He is the hand you stretch out to sinners. He is the way that leads to your peace. God our Father, we had wandered far from you, but through your Son you have brought us back. You gave him up to death so that we might turn again to you and find our way to one another.

Food Bank

The numbers of people using our Thursday Pop up Foodbank is steadily rising. We regularly get 60 visitors a week now. They come from all parts of society, young families, middle aged people who have lost a job, or have suffered family breakdown, and pensioners who are trying to meet the cost of living. They also include Ukrainian people who have limited income in this country. We receive kind donations from parishioners, including cash with which we buy fresh meat and eggs, but our tinned food and vegetables come from the permanent food bank run by Opendoor. Following a glut over Christmas, their stocks have run low and we are particularly short of tinned meats.
