The National Cycle of Prayer—During Ordinary time (Autumn), i.e. from September to Christ the King, we are asked to pray for these intentions:

The harvest: The fruits of hard Work and the reverent use of creation; especially on World Day of Prayer for the Care of creation (1st September) and on last Sunday in September or whenever Harvest Festivals are held.

The Church has long celebrated the agricultural harvest. This intention also includes all human work. In all circumstances of human life there are choices to be made regarding the environment and our reverent stewardship of God's gift to creation. "The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become vast. Therefore the earth's treasures no longer serve to build God's garden for all to live in, but they have been made to serve the powers of exploitation and destruction." (*Benedict XVI, homily at Inaugural Mass, 2005.*)

O Lord. Good Father, who in your providence have entrusted the earth to the human race, grant, we pray, that with the fruits harvested from it we may be able to sustain life and, with your help, always use them to promote your praise and the wellbeing of all. *Roman Missal.*
