EU CITIZENS SETTLED STATUS

IMPORTANT & URGENT

Following the UK's exit from the European Union, here is an update about the Settlement scheme for European Citizens who have made their homes here and who wish to remain.

All EU citizens living in the UK are required by the Government to apply through its Settlement Scheme to continue living, working and accessing services here.

The deadline for applications is 30th June 2020. Full details are to be found at www.gov.uk/eusettledstatus.

The Catholic Church in England and Wales stands in solidarity with all European citizens who have made their homes here. They are a valued part of our parishes, schools and communities.

Disability Terminations-

Currently terminations can only take place up to 24 weeks gestation unless a baby is “seriously disabled”. Cleft palate, club foot and Downs syndrome are just some conditions defined as ‘serious’. Once a serious condition is confirmed, the only limit to terminating the pregnancy is when a woman actually goes into labour, (so full term) and she may feel great pressure to do so. The United Nations Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities recently criticised the UK for many aspects of its treatment of disabled people today. A legal challenge is being brought against the government arguing that the current abortion limit should apply to all pregnancies. The right to end a pregnancy after the 24 week limit for those with disabilities is a direct discrimination and should not be lawful.
