Fr. Christopher writes:

At the Deanery Station Mass in Bury St. Edmunds on 18th March, Fr. David Bagstaff preached on Our Lords Summary of the Law. He said that the Wisdom of the Old testament was distilled by Jesus into the two commands of the New Testament: Love of God and love of neighbour. Because of the fact there are no public Masses and because of social distancing we need to find ways of living out these commands in changing circumstances.

I wrote last week that if we cannot be at Mass we can at least read the Sunday Scriptures and make an Act of Spiritual Communion.

“Lord Jesus Christ, I believe you to be truly present in the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist. I unite myself with the celebration of Mass throughout the World. As I cannot receive you sacramentally, come to me spiritually. Bless me and all those for whom I have a duty to pray. Make me grateful for your many blessings. Amen”

We can also take part in Mass on line, these are listed on the front cover of this newsletter.

There are other resources worth looking at:

- ◆ **CAFOD** is providing an online virtual Children's Liturgy each week at 10am GMT
- ◆ **Magnificat**, the month Catholic Magazine has responded to the current coronavirus by waiving subscription to its on line version for the duration of the present crisis. This means you can get free access to the daily Mass readings, as well as morning, evening, and night prayers, meditations and articles on the saints.
- ◆ **The Wednesday Word.** In the Wednesday Word Fr. Henry Wansborough, offers prayerful reflections on the Sunday Mass readings.
His commentary really does help us get the most out of the scriptures we hear at Mass. More than that, the Wednesday Word, is a springboard to prayer and action.
