Fr. Christopher writes:

It hardly seems possible that we shall be celebrating Holy Week and Easter in isolation from one another. The Paschal Mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection has brought us together and has made us the Holy People of God; one in faith, hope, and love. This is what we are in virtue of our baptism; the sacrament which plunges us into the mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection. Thanks to modern technology it will be possible to follow the liturgies of Holy Week, albeit in truncated form from Walsingham or elsewhere. If we are unable to follow the liturgies online, at least try to follow the readings in your missal. On Holy Thursday: recall the command that Jesus gives to love one another as he has loved us; give thanks for the gift of the Eucharist which puts us in touch with the Lord and all that he has done for us in his death and resurrection. On Good Friday give thanks for the death of the Lord which has broken the power of sin and death. On Holy Saturday/Easter Sunday rejoice in the resurrection of the Lord, giving thanks for the new and eternal life which is ours through faith and the sacraments.

In these troubled and anxious times, may we know that peace which is the Risen Lord's gift to his friends.
