YOUTH SUNDAY

Pope Francis has asked that as well as International World Youth Days, 'Youth Sunday' celebrated on the Solemnity of Christ of the King is to be relaunched and now known as 'World Youth Day'. This is somewhat confusing and will take a bit of getting used to! With the relaunch comes fresh energy to recognise and celebrate young people and their invaluable contribution to the life of the local, national and universal church. There will be new resources available which you or a catechist may find useful to help celebrate in your parish.

Also, each diocese throughout the world has been asked to hold a special event. We have chosen to run ours on Saturday 20th November and are calling it 'Word Youth Day East Anglia'. Although we will be having a vigil Mass, this will enable any young people that come to the event to also be in their parish on the Sunday, if you are celebrating in your parish.

SVP

On Monday last week, the Newmarket Conference of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) made lunch for 44 parents and their children (plus our own helpers) in the Parish Centre. This is something we endeavour to do weekly during school holidays and half-term breaks. The aim is to ensure families, who have made the request, have a hot meal and a warm place to come and play/chat. Parish Synod Team (PST)

Pope Francis has launched a worldwide 'synod' process. Synod simply means 'journeying together'. The Holy Father is inviting us to listen deeply to one another and to discern what God is saying to the Church about how we 'journey together'. We will have our own synodal pathway, within our parishes and communities in the Diocese of East Anglia, united with every diocese across the world. Then, after national and continental gatherings, the Synod of Bishops will gather in Rome in 2023 to reflect on what has been heard. The fundamental questions for the Synod are:

- How is our 'journeying together' as the Church happening today in our parish/community?
- What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'?

Great hope is placed on this Synod. It is to be a time, Pope Francis says, "to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, ... to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission." [Vademecum, Vatican's Synod Preparation Document]

The key factors in journeying together are listening and discerning. It begins with listening to all the baptised, with special care taken to include those who are often left out. By listening carefully to each other, we are able to hear how the Holy Spirit is speaking to each person and thus to discern what God is saying to all of us, the whole Church.

To the faithful of the Diocese of Rome, 18 September 2021, Pope Francis said, "I encourage you to take this synodal process seriously and tell you that the Holy Spirit needs you. And this is true: the Holy Spirit needs us. Listen to it by listening to yourself. Don't leave anyone out or behind."

We hope everyone will participate - we all have a voice and we can all listen to one another. Begin with prayer, and reflection:

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in reflecting on your experience of 'journeying together', both through the pandemic and wider.

- When has journeying together been a source of joy; and a source of pain?
- When we say 'Church', who do we mean?
- What might the Holy Spirit be saying about how we journey together as the Church?

Then, through November, December and early January, there will be wide opportunity to attend one or more small meetings (5-7 people) in the parish for sharing and listening to one another. Details will be in the newsletter, on the parish website, on the notice boards: please do look out for them and tell you friends, especially those on the margins! May the Holy Spirit give us all courage to speak, ears to listen, and hearts to love. Juliet and Richard Burnford

NB - we would normally run the course for Year 10 upwards. If you have a Year 9 child who you feel is at a suitable place and maturity, feel free to discuss this with us on the 7th. Thank you!
